# Diversity Defined



## Definition of *diversity*

- **1:** the condition of having or being composed of differing elements : VARIETY especially : the inclusion of different types of people (such as people of different races or cultures) in a group or organization // programs intended to promote *diversity* in schools
- **2:** an instance of being composed of differing elements or qualities : an instance of being diverse // a *diversity* of opinion

## What does mean diversity?

- It means understanding that each individual is unique, and recognizing our individual differences. These can be along the dimensions of race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, socio-economic status, age, physical abilities, religious beliefs, political beliefs, or other ideologies.

### Definition of *inclusion*

**1:** the act of [including](#) : the state of being [included](#)

**2:** something that is included

**3:** the act or practice of including students with disabilities with the general student population  
//*Inclusion* refers to a variety of integration approaches, but the goal is to blend special education students into the traditional classroom.— Suevon Lee

**4:** the act or practice of including and accommodating people who have historically been excluded (as because of their race, gender, sexuality, or ability)...

//academic libraries have traditionally struggled to address problems of equity, diversity and *inclusion*. The low representation of people of color in library staff has been a particular shortcoming, despite many initiatives to attract minority staff to the field.— Lindsay McKenzie

//Tech workers say they are more interested in diversity and are more willing to work to promote *inclusion* in their workplace ...— Jessica Guynn

//Meaningful civic *inclusion* even now eludes many of our fellow citizens who are recognizably of African descent.— Glenn C. Loury

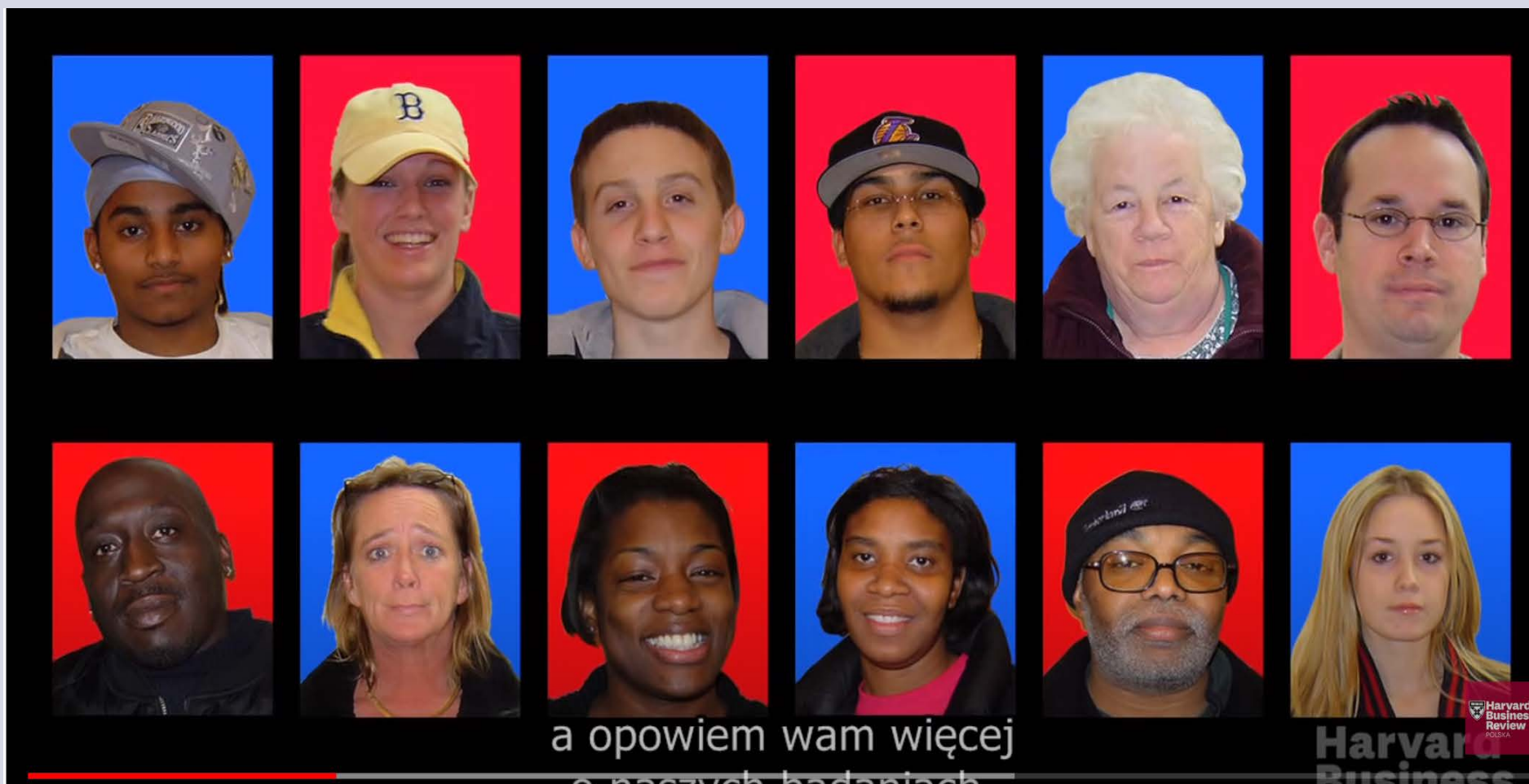
## Cultures are MULTIPLE
